The controls and safeguards used by organisations to ensure that personal data is processed lawfully and securely.







- Respond quickly to incidents



Figure 2.1: Percentage of organisations that have identified breaches or attacks in the last 12 months

All UK businesses	Primary schools	Secondary schools	Further education colleges	Higher education colleges
39%	41%	70%	88%	92%




DPE gets (12 month average) 2 per day

...and it increases year on year



How long and what about?

- Easy...immediate
- Hard...weeks/months/years



Impacts on SLT time and admin resources

Data protection is regulated in law - you must have a compliance programme



Type of breach or attack	Businesses	Primary schools	Secondary schools	Further education colleges	Higher education colleges
Phishing attacks	83%	88%	87%	93%	97%
Others impersonating organisation in emails or online	27%	25%	46%	63%	79%
Viruses, spyware or malware (excluding ransomware)	12%	14%	15%	13%	59%
Denial of service attacks	4%	6%	15%	30%	35%
Takeover of organisation's user accounts	8%	7%	13%	10%	26%
Hacking or attempted hacking of online bank accounts	8%	1%	7%	3%	18%
Ransomware	4%	2%	5%	7%	18%
Unauthorised accessing of files or networks by staff	1%	4%	9%	13%	32%



Activities undertaken to identify cyber security risks in the last 12 months	Businesses	Primary schools	Secondary schools	Further education colleges	Higher education institutions
Any of the listed activities	52%	60%	76%	86%	100%
Used specific tools designed for security monitoring	35%	41%	65%	76%	95%
Risk assessment covering cyber security risks	33%	48%	59%	76%	89%
Testing staff awareness and response (e.g. mock phishing)	19%	37%	48%	71%	65%
A cyber security vulnerability audit	17%	27%	46%	76%	92%
